Happy Birthday USPS! Yes, the United States Power Squadrons organization is celebrating its Centennial in 2014.

USPS traces its beginnings to a subgroup within the Boston Yacht Club formed to promote and protect the interests of boats powered by the new internal combustion engines. During World Wars I and II, USPS served the national defense effort by training people in navigation and boat-handling skills. In the post war era emphasis shifted to teaching general boating skills to the growing number of recreational boaters. Today, promoting safe enjoyment by families of boating activities of all types by is a major thrust of the organization. (See the Winter 2014 issue of *The Ensign* for a more complete USPS

history.)

In the early days, USPS squadrons emphasized naval-type drills and maneuvers. Although such activities soon grew out of favor, a growing number of our educational programs offer on-the-water components, an approach pioneered by our own Seneca Sail and Power Squadron, chartered in 1960.

Reading back over this history, one is struck by how USPS has evolved (sometimes belatedly - women were not admitted as general members until 1982!) in response to the changing needs of society. What will the future bring? Who knows? But we should take the opportunity to celebrate the present, and our Executive Committee is planning some fun and interesting activities for the coming season. If that process cycles over and over we could have a very interesting launch day.

So it would be wise, especially after the many freeze-thaw cycles that we experienced this winter, to give things a very close look as we prepare for this next season. It would be easier to find things

before the ice melts, because it would still be lifted/pushed out of shape, but once it thaws, pipes and pumps might look pretty normal. Don't assume, give them a test. It'll save a lot of embarrassment.

United States Power Squadron is celebrating its 100th anniversary throughout 2014. In conjunction with that celebration, Seneca Sail and Power is now implementing the strategic plan that we worked on last year. We are looking forward to making more connections with people and businesses and organizations in our region and increasing our visibility. Educational Updates

In order to keep warm this winter, the Educational Department of our squadron has been working overtime. There has been a lot of activity and we are queuing up a lot more, so I'll get right to it.

Operations Training

This course is recommended for all USPS members and strongly suggested for members in leadership roles. The course serves as an orientation to the many facets of the organization and the procedures that have been developed over the last century for conducting USPS business.

- Prerequisites: None.
- When: 30 minutes of each of the next 3-4 Bridge meetings will be set aside to cover this material.
- Where: Bridge Meeting location.
- Lead Instructor: Charlie Fausold
- Registration Deadline: March 24th, 2014
- Cost: FREE to USPS members.

Instructor Development

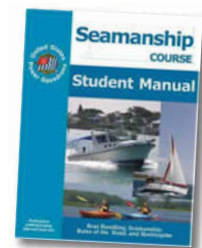
Unlike other USPS courses, the Instructor Development course is not designed to enhance boating skills. Rather, its emphasis is on enhancing presentation techniques and instructor skills. The course has been designed to demonstrate interactive teaching methods focused on adult learning and has been expanded from four to eight weeks in duration.

Students are required to prepare lesson plans and give three presentations to their peers utilizing a variety of teaching aids and presentation skills. The instructor may assign a topic for these presentations or you may use material and PowerPoint slides from existing USPS courses, and they may build on one another.

 - Access to computer with Internet connection.
 - Access to presentation software (e.g., PowerPoint or Keynote)

- Duration: 8 weeks
- Where: Big Flats Community Center

Seamanship – Family Edition

The Seamanship course is the next step after completing America's Boating Course (ABC), taking the knowledge and skills learned there and expanding and extending them with this newly updated edition. The course presents material applicable to both power and sail, covering such topics as the construction and functioning of a boat, the skipper's responsibilities, preparing the boat for use, handling

and maneuvering a vessel under various conditions in close quarters and on the open water, rules of the road, anchoring, emergencies, and marlinspike/basic knots.

The Seneca Squadron is altering the presentation of this class slightly from prior years in order to make it more family-friendly and youth-oriented. (Course content remains unchanged.)

Piloting

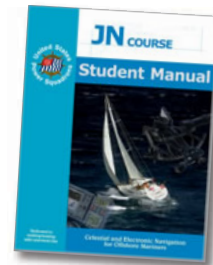
Piloting is the USPS introductory course to the art and science of navigation. This course takes a practical look at boat navigation in which GPS is the primary instrument used. The course will also teach you the traditional navigational skills needed for those cases when (not if) your boat electronics should suffer some "performance issues."

- Prerequisites: None
- When: Fall 2014
- Duration: 8 weeks
- Instructors: Jim McGinnis & Ray Margeson
- Registration Deadline: TBA
- Estimated Cost: \$95

Junior Navigation

The first of two offshore navigation classes that will prepare you to cross oceans. While still utilizing GPS, this course provides the fundamentals of celestial navigation and shows you how to obtain your position utilizing the sun.

This course requires classroom work as well as fieldwork during which you will collect celestial observations needed to complete the course. The squadron will provide sextants if you do not have one.



For those of you who have endured the intense pace of some of the other Squadron courses to get here, you will be relieved to know that we tend to kick our heels back a bit and take our time with this one. The class will start in the fall, but only meet every other week (and take some time off for the Holidays), with a finish date some time in the spring. In addition, this schedule will allow the course to finish up as the weather begins to moderate, providing you with more (and better) opportunities to complete the field work required.

- When: Fall 2014
- Duration: 12-16 weeks (meets every other week)
- Instructors: Tom Alley & Jim Morris

- Estimated Cost: \$140-\$150

New! SSPS Junior Sailing Program

The Seneca Sail & Power Squadron, in cooperation with the Finger Lakes Yacht Club, is launching a pilot program this summer to better engage our area youth and introduce them to boating that's not just responsible, but fun, too!

By the time you read this, SSPS will already be reaching out to various schools in our area to see if we can find a few students interested in forming a sail racing team to represent their school. Each school will be assigned a coach from among SSPS's pool of on-the-water instructors. The instructors will use their boats both as a classroom and as a race boat.

We'll start the summer out slowly with each coach introducing his or her crew to their boat and instructing them on the basics of boat handling, sailing, and of course, safety. By mid-summer we should be ready to start some practice races between crews and, since there is some school pride involved, there is the hope for some good-natured rivalries to be formed!

Crews and teams will then compete in four scored races during August and September alongside the FLYC fleet during their regular Summer Series. The intent is to have the students actually run the boats under the watchful eye of their coach and mentor.

Along the way, students will be given the opportunity to get their NYS Boater Safety certification

and/or enroll in the Seamanship class as well.

All students enrolled in the program will be USPS Junior Members with full access to all of the USPS educational opportunities and member benefits.

Parents will be invited to join in as well, as this program will be integrated into the FLYC social programs so that students (and parents) can mingle with one another after the races. Of course, they'll also be getting an introduction to the Power Squadrons and all that we represent.

This year will be a pilot program to test its feasibility and effectiveness along with Seneca's ability to sustain this activity.

Room Reservation Process for Spring Conference 2014

We will continue to use the e-mail process and thereby take advantage of our tax-exempt status by making group reservations by Squadron under the Squadron’s tax-exempt number. Meal reservations will continue to be made through the host squadron (Rochester Sail and Power Squadron) and are covered under the District 6 tax-exempt number. **Deadline for room reservations is 28 Feb 2014 and meal reservations deadline is 21 March 2014.**

SQUADRON MEMBERS: Please send your reservation form below to your Commander.

COMMANDERS: Clarion Hotel, Batavia, NY, welcomes the squadron reservations by e-mail. The process remains simple. An e-mail form letter was sent to the squadron commanders explaining the process and what rooms are available for hospitality use. Just fill in the blanks to include the squadron tax-exempt number, room requests and the commander’s name and credit card number. Then e-mail the form to the hotel at the address shown on the form. Revisions, such as add-ons, are acceptable and can be forwarded to the hotel using the same form. Upon checkout rooms have to be paid for by cash, squadron credit card or squadron check. Note: those members wishing to by-pass the tax-exempt process and take advantage of credit card perks etc. can register in the same manner by stating they will pay their entire bill by credit card at checkout.

We have 47 sleeping rooms available for our Spring Conference at a rate of \$89.00 per night, single or double occupancy (LIMITED KING BED ROOMS AVAILABE AT SAME PRICE). Clarion Hotel will assign the rooms on a first received basis.
